- 2. A breakdown of how many disabled people waiting for a suitable home require a family sized home with two, three or four bedrooms and how many need a one-bedroom property.
- 3. A breakdown on how many people have physical disabilities with mobility requirements i.e., need wheelchair access.
- 4. Also details of how many people have visual impairments or mental health illnesses, learning disabilities and additional needs that require suitable housing.

Your request has been processed and considered under the terms of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002. The information requested has come from Inverclyde Common Housing Register (ICHR) and is provided below:
